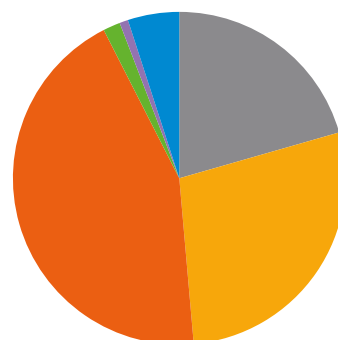

TOP TIPS

RECYCLING RATE



1 - System Redesign

Redesigning the internal bin layout can maximise your recycling rates and reduce the risk of recyclables going to general waste.

2 - Stickers and Posters

Labelling your bins and putting up posters significantly reduces the risk of contamination and confusion over where materials go.

3 - Staff Training & Enhanced Communications

Using clearly labelled bins is not difficult, but there is often a lot of confusion regarding which materials go where and why. Staff training can help reduce confusion and in turn the risk of contamination.
